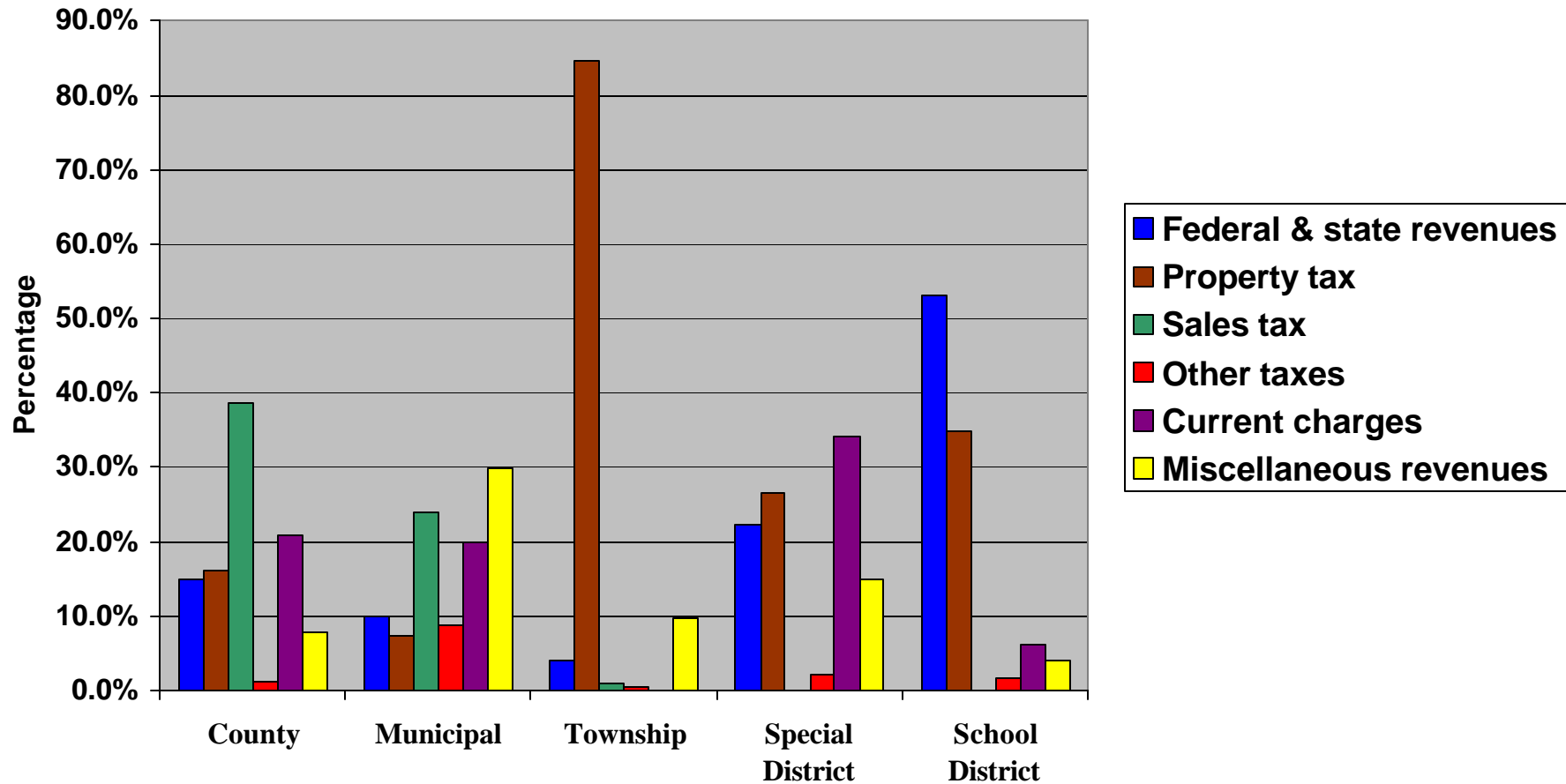

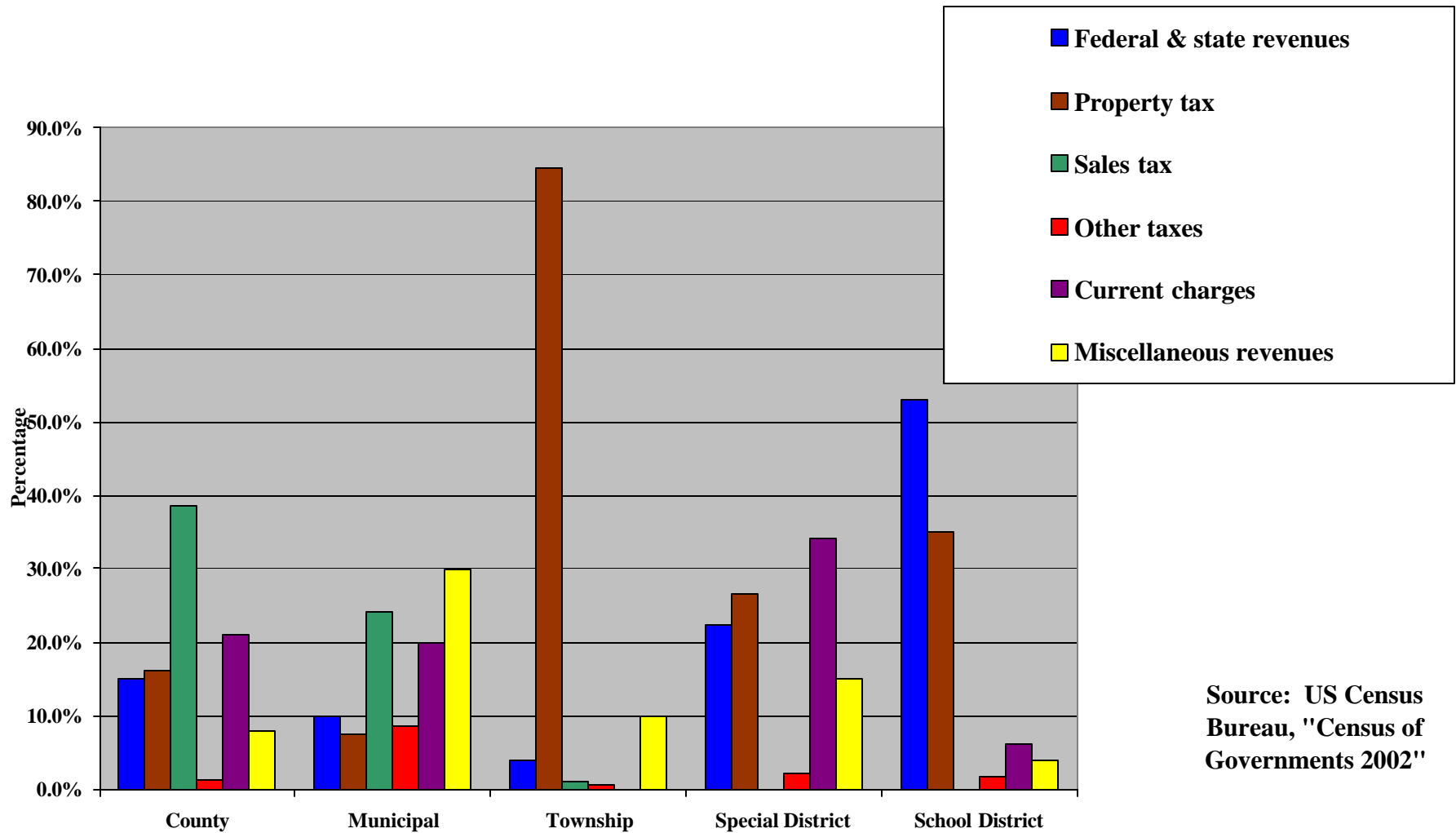
Sources of General Revenues for Missouri Local Governments: 2002

READING**EXPENDITURES AND REVENUES****Expenditures**

Social services and income support includes: public welfare, hospitals and health, social insurance administration, and veterans' services. Hospitals and health are the major expenditures for both counties and cities in this category. Hospitals that are owned by a city or county, rather than a hospital district, are included in this category.

The transportation provided by school districts is not shown in the transportation category, because this is transportation only for a specific use.

The major category of spending in "Parks, housing, sewerage and waste," is parks for cities and counties. Sewerage is a close second for cities.

Public safety includes police, fire, inspection services and corrections.

General administration is for administration that cannot be attributed to one program. School administration can be attributed to schools and is not included here. Courts, city and county governing councils, voting and public record keeping are examples of administrative activities that cannot be attributed to a single program and are included in this category.

Revenues

The other taxes include the earnings tax used by Kansas City and St. Louis and accounts for the majority of the taxes reported under this category for cities. This category also includes the motor vehicle licenses.

Current charges include any services that are paid for, all or in part, by the user: college and university fees, school lunches, hospitals (if it is publicly owned), airport fees, public parking fees, port facilities, park and recreation fees, sewer fees, etc.

Miscellaneous revenues include revenues from publicly-owned utilities, interest, special assessments, sale of property. It also includes unemployment, workers compensation, retirement and other insurance fund revenues that are used for specific purposes.
