COMMUNITY BUILDINGS CARDS

The Care-a-Lot Card Shop sells all types of greeting cards, gifts, wrapping paper, and ornaments. It has large display windows covered with pink and white striped awnings.

Good Sport Sporting Goods carries athletic garb as well as every kind of ball, hockey gear, football pads, bats, and gloves. It has a side-lot basketball court for its customers.

ACTIVITY 3

INFRASTRUCTURE

Infrastructure - Streets

Your task is to construct the streets in the community. The streets near factories and businesses should be wide enough to accommodate hauling and delivery trucks. Streets near homes are generally just wide enough to accommodate two curb lanes for parking and perhaps two lanes of traffic. The speed limit on streets with commercial traffic is often higher than on residential streets.

Infrastructure - Bus Routes

Buses should run at convenient intervals and times for commuters. Buses need wide streets, especially for turning corners. Buses use a lot of fuel, so the routes should be as direct as possible.
